Reader 4: Compassionate One, with you is the well of life, and in your light we see light: Be present throughout the world to protect and uphold all who live with poverty, disease, violence, or threat, that they may be delivered from their distress. Your love, O God, reaches to the heavens; **and your faithfulness to the clouds.**

Reader 5: Loving God, let your gracious healing power be with those for whom we pray, especially (Add Prayer List). Generous God, we offer to you our grateful praise, giving thanks. Never-failing God, we remember before you those who died. Your love, O God, reaches to the heavens; **and your faithfulness to the clouds.**

**(Together) God of abundance, as you turned the water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana, so let your transforming presence enliven our hearts and renew the world, that the earth may be filled with the power of your Spirit and be reconciled within the nurturing love of your Son, Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever.
