Reader 4: Be with us in this community that we may be glad witnesses of your goodness, O Holy One. Alleluia! Christ is risen. **Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

Reader 5: Let Christ's resurrection power bring healing and hope to those for whom we pray, especially (Add Prayer List), Hear our prayers of grateful gladness this Easter Day. Remember in the light of the resurrection those who have died, especially Millicent Chesley. Alleluia! Christ is risen. **Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

(Together): You have raised Jesus of Nazareth from death on the cross into resurrection life, O Eternal One: Feed us with his life as we eat and drink with him in this Easter Eucharist, that we may be his witnesses, sharing in the Spirit's work of reconciliation and peace, through the Risen One, Jesus Christ our Saviour.
