

### **The Collect for Purity**

Celebrant: Almighty God,

**People:** to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hidden. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen

### **The Collect for the Day:**

*(Together)* **Almighty and everliving God, in tender love for all our human race you sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take our flesh and suffer death upon a cruel cross. May we follow the example of his great humility, and share in the glory of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.**

**Psalm** 31 9-16

<sup>9</sup> Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am in trouble; \* my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly.

<sup>10</sup> **For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing; \*my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed.**

<sup>11</sup> I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbours, a dismay to those of my acquaintance; \* when they see me in the street they avoid me

<sup>12</sup> **I am forgotten like a dead man, out of mind; \* I am as useless as a broken pot.**

<sup>13</sup> For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is all around; \* they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life.

## Prayers of the People

### Palm Sunday

**Priest+:** Loving God, through the passion of your Son Jesus you have poured out your divine life in love for us despite our evil: Strengthen us to take up our cross and to follow in his way, that we may share in your redeeming work, as we pray: We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

Reader 1: Loving God, you have given your people the confidence to come before you through the new and living way that Jesus Christ has opened for us. Grant your church grace to provoke one another to love and good deeds, encouraging one another in Christ. In the church we pray for David our Archbishop, Brent our Archdeacon, Wendy our priest and all in leadership roles. May they lead us to understand the love of Jesus and His message. Bless your Church and her members as we labour in your vineyard, that we may be fruitful, as we live our lives in a manner worthy of the gospel, and live faithfully in your loving presence. You have called your Church to be the community of the crucified One, O Gracious One: Help us to walk in Christ’s path of obedient humility, that we may be willing to suffer for the sake of your goodness. We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

Reader 2: In Christ’s exultation upon the cross you have made a mockery of the pretensions of the rulers and authorities of the world, Almighty One: Grant to all leaders the strength to walk in your way of humble service that we may be saved from all tyranny and oppression. We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

Reader 3: Compassionate One, We bring to your care all whose lives are wasted with grief and their years with sighing, as we pray for all who suffer throughout the world. We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

Reader 4: Our times are in your hand, and you sustain the weary with a word, Our Loving God: Uphold all in our community who endure shame or threat, that they may turn to the cross and be comforted. We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

Reader 5: We pray for those among us who need your saving help, especially( Add Parish List). We give you thanks for pouring your divine life into our lives, as we offer our gratefulness in thanksgiving. We pray for

all who have followed Christ along the human journey into death, especially Joan Stevens . Let them be united in his death and raised into his glory. We have trusted in you, O God. **We have said, “You are our God.”**

**(Together): Gracious God, your Son Jesus endured mockery, pain and death in order to reveal to us your power that overcomes evil with love and brings life out of death: Guide and guard us in our earthly pilgrimage, that we may gladly share in his passion and be raised with him into your glory, who with the Holy Spirit lives and reigns , One God, forever and ever. Amen.**

#### Confession and Absolution

Celebrant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God’s forgiveness.

Celebrant; Most merciful God,

**People: we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.**

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**People: Amen.**

**(Together) Gracious God, the suffering and death of Jesus, your only Son, makes us pleasing in your sight. Alone we can do nothing, but through his sacrifice, may we receive your love and mercy. Amen.**
