PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Trinity Sunday

Priest: Holy Trinity, One God, the whole world is filled with your glory: Hear the prayers of your children as we say: Ascribe due honor to God’s holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

Reader 1: Loving God, you have given your people the confidence to come before you through the new and living way that Jesus Christ has opened for us. Grant your church grace to provoke one another to love and good deeds, encouraging one another in Christ. In the church we pray for David our Archbishop, Brent our Archdeacon, Wendy our Priest and all in leadership roles. May they lead us to understand the love of Jesus and His message. Bless your Church and her members as we labour in your vineyard, that we may be fruitful, as we live our lives in a manner worthy of the gospel, and live faithfully in your loving presence. Abba! Father! You have filled your Church with your Spirit and adopted us as your own children: Inspire us to speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen. Ascribe due honor to God’s holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

Reader 2: Your Son Jesus, the Son of Man, was lifted up to give the whole world eternal life: Send Christ’s compassion and understanding to all who exercise roles of power and authority, that they may be led by the Spirit of God in the ways of justice and peace. Ascribe due honor to God’s holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

Reader 3: Through the ever present and energizing Spirit your presence sustains the world and brings all life into being: Protect, comfort, and heal all who live with illness, threat, poverty or oppression throughout the world, that they may enjoy the goodness of your blessing. Ascribe due honor to God’s holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

Reader 4: Glorious Trinity, One God, enable our community to be born from above, born of water and Spirit, that we may manifest your loving compassion and peace toward all. Ascribe due honor to God’s holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

Reader 5: Your children, O God, have not received a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but we have received a spirit of adoption, through which we ask for your aid: Hear our prayers for (Add Parish List). Accept our praise and thanksgiving. Embrace with your eternal life those who have died, For you did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Ascribe due honour to God's holy Name; **worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.**

(Together): Let our prayers and praises fill your temple, O Father, as you send forth your Spirit into the world to empower your children to do the deeds of your Son and to be signs of your divine presence; we pray in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ who lives and reigns with you, O Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Confession and Absolution

Celebrant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Celebrant; Most merciful God,

People: we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.
