

## *Prayers of the People* *The Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost*

Priest: Gracious God, you manifest your power primarily in showing compassion and love for all humanity: Listen to us as we call upon you in prayer, saying: O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

Reader 1: Loving God, you have given your people the confidence to come before you through the new and living way that Jesus Christ has opened for us. Grant your church grace to provoke one another to love and good deeds, encouraging one another in Christ. In the church we pray for David our Archbishop, Brent our Archdeacon, Wendy our Priest and all in leadership roles. May they lead us to understand the love of Jesus and His message. Bless your Church and her members as we labour in your vineyard, that we may be fruitful, as we live our lives in a manner worthy of the gospel, and live faithfully in your loving presence. You have called your Church to become a community of humble servants, having been baptized with the baptism of Jesus: Guide your people into such faithfulness, that we may serve the world in your name. O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

Reader 2: You have become for our leaders an example of service through sacrifice: Give the rulers of this world a heart for justice and peace and teach them that those who wish to be first must become slave of all. O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

Reader 3: You have clothed your creation with majesty and splendor: Open our eyes to see the beauty all around us and give us a reverence for the natural resources at our disposal. O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

Reader 4: You have promised to hear our prayers and supplications through Jesus, our great high priest: Receive the prayers we lift to you as we intercede for all who suffer throughout the world, especially those who face tyranny, violence, oppression, or poverty. O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

Reader 5: We offer our prayers for those for whom we are called to pray, especially (Add Prayer List). We offer our grateful thanks for your presence and deliverance. Let those who have died sit with the triumphant Christ in glory. O God, how manifold are your works; **in wisdom you have made them all.**

**(Together) Almighty God, through your servant Jesus Christ, you have made many righteous, raising him from suffering into glory: Let your resurrection power be present to all in need as you strengthen us for service in your name; through the same Jesus Christ, our savior, who with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns in unity and love, forever and ever. Amen.**

### Confession and Absolution

Celebrant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Celebrant; Most merciful God,

**People: we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.**

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**People: Amen.**
