Celebrant: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

People: And also with you.

The Collect for Purity

Celebrant: Almighty God,

People: to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hidden. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen

The Collect for the Day

(Together): Almighty God, your Son Jesus Christ has taught us that what we do for the least of your children we do also for him. Give us the will to serve others as he was the servant of all, who gave up his life and died for us, but lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen

5 For his wrath endures but the twinkling of an eye, * his favour for a lifetime.

6 Weeping may spend the night, * but joy comes in the morning.

7 While I felt secure, I said, "I shall never be disturbed. * You, Lord, with your favour, made me as strong as the mountains."

The Apostles' Creed

Celebrant: Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Prayers of the People *Fourth Sunday after Pentecost*

Priest: O God you have embraced our lives and our deaths through the incarnation of your Son Jesus Christ, grant that we may walk in newness of life as we pray for the needs of the world, saying: Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

Reader 1. Loving God, you have given your people the confidence to come before you through the new and living way that Jesus Christ has opened for us. Grant your church grace to provoke one another to love and good deeds, encouraging one another in Christ. In the church we pray for David our Bishop, Brent our Archdeacon, Wendy our Priest and all in leadership roles. May they lead us to understand the love of Jesus and His message. Bless your Church and her members as we labour in your vineyard, that we may be fruitful, as we live our lives in a manner worthy of the gospel, and live faithfully in your loving presence. Abba! Father! You have filled your Church with your Spirit and adopted us as your own children: Inspire us to speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen. Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

Reader 2. Let your resurrection life renew the face of the earth in every nation, Almighty One, that you may deliver the lives of the needy from the hands of evildoers. Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

Reader 3. Let your resurrection life enfold the disinherited, dispossessed, and refugees; those who are cast out and oppressed; those who suffer jealousy and prejudice; mothers and children who are helpless and hopeless: As you care for the fall of the sparrow, keep watch over the lives of your children and rescue the suffering. Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

Reader 4. Let your resurrection life gladden all souls in our community and inspire us to the challenging faithfulness of living in Christ, walking in the way of the cross, and being free from sin. Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

Reader 5. Let your resurrection life accept our prayers and intercessions as the people who acknowledge you: We remember especially all those on our parish prayer list and all those on our hearts alone. We remember those who have been united to Christ in a death like his and those whose faith is known to you alone, that they be united with Christ in his resurrection. Give ear, O Lord to our prayer; **and attend to the voice of our supplication.**

(Together): Gracious and loving God, hear our prayers which we offer to you, and free us through the resurrection of Jesus, that we may lose our lives for the sake of Christ, and live renewed by the glory of the Father, in the unity of the Spirit, for ever and ever. Amen.

Confession and Absolution

Celebrant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Celebrant; Most merciful God,

People: we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.
