The Church has received God's promises made perfect in Jesus, and we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses: Empower us, O Gracious One, to run with perseverance the race that is set before us that we may share in your reconciling work. Stir up your strength..... **and come to help us.**

Reader 2. You have called your people to create structures of justice and righteousness, O Compassionate One: Inspire our leaders and all in authority with such divine vision and grace that they will work to deliver the weak and poor from all powers of oppression. Stir up your strength**and come to help us.**

Reader 3. You hear the cry of the poor and ill, and you act to relieve oppression throughout the world, O Righteous One: Honor the needs of all who suffer throughout the world and bring them your goodness and life. Stir up your strength**and come to help us.**

Reader 4. You have planted us among fertile hills in a pleasant land, O Generous One: Lead us to fulfill your compassionate purpose for our community and for all the people of the world. Stir up your strength.... **and come to help us.**

Reader 5. Let those who suffer look to the cross of Christ who has endured, and who now sits at the right hand of the throne of God. We remember especially all those on our parish prayer list.....(add names known) We entrust to you, as the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, those who have died. Stir up your strength**and come to help us.**

(Together): Enlighten us with your grace, O God, and bring wisdom out of all of our divisions and conflicts, that we may interpret rightly the present time and so understand the signs of our confusion so that we may cooperate with your will to reconcile and heal the world, through Jesus Christ our Saviour, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns one God, world without end. Amen

Psalm 139: 1-6, 13-18

¹ Lord, you have searched me out and known me; * you know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar.

2 You trace my journeys and my resting-places * and are acquainted with all my ways.

3 Indeed, there is not a word on my lips, * but you, O Lord, know it altogether

4 You press upon me behind and before * and lay your hand upon me.

5 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; * it is so high that I cannot attain to it.

6 Where can I go then from your Spirit? * where can I flee from your presence

13 I will thank you because I am marvellously made; * your works are wonderful, and I know it well.

14 My body was not hidden from you, * while I was being made in secret and woven in the depths of the earth.

15 Your eyes beheld my limbs, yet unfinished in the womb; all of them were written in your book; * they were fashioned day by day, when as yet there was none of them.

16 How deep I find your thoughts, O God! * how great is the sum of them!

17 If I were to count them, they would be more in number than the sand; * to count them all, my life span would need to be like yours.

18 Oh, that you would slay the wicked, O God! * You that thirst for blood, depart from me.

(Together): God of mystery and power, even our minds and hearts are the veils and signs of your presence. We come in silent wonder to learn the way of simplicity, the eternal road that leads to love for you and for your whole creation. We come as your Son Jesus Christ taught us, and in his name. Amen
